# RUSSIAN STRATEGIC AND TACTICAL GOALS IN THE BALKANS IN 1915

ABSTRACT: On the basis of archival materials, memoirs and the corresponding historiography the author considers the dynamics of the development of Russian strategic and tactical interests in the Balkans in 1915 and raises a question of the reasons for the Russian foreign policy defeat in the Balkans in the years of World War I.

KEYWORDS: WWI, Russian Empire, Balkans, logistics, transport network, rail links, military cargo transfer, Serbia, Greece, Bulgaria, Montenegro.

With the passing of the first months of WWI, the Russian Empire crystallized several points of its interest in the Balkans. The main strategic goal legalized after the Ottoman Empire assault on the Russian Black Sea shores was "the return of the Orthodox Cross on the church of St. Sophia", which was a cover-up for the control of the Passes<sup>1</sup>. It had been an "idée fixe" of the Russian Empire<sup>2</sup> such as Gibraltar had been for
